## The Myth: Voting Machines Eliminate the Need for Hand Counting

Many clerks believe the 2-5% post-election audit of machines is enough hand counting knowledge, dismissing the need for a full hand count process. They find audits tedious and assume machines will always suffice. This myth overlooks a critical reality: federal, state, and local laws require "continuity of government," meaning elections must proceed even during emergencies like power outages, natural disasters, or cyberattacks.

## Finding: Emergencies Demand Hand Count Preparedness

Catastrophic events can disable voting machines or prevent their transport to polling places, necessitating hand counting. Clerks are obligated to have a "Plan B" to ensure elections occur under any circumstance. Pre-planning is vital — without power, communication, or equipment, hand counting becomes the only option to maintain election integrity and continuity of government.
